

**Three Teaching Artists needed for Gardens for Humanity's
"Celebrating the Art in Earth" art and environmental education program.**

WHAT WE DO:

Gardens for Humanity offers a one-of-a-kind art and environmental educational program serving schools in Sedona and the Verde Valley. This program not only provides multi-media art activities that connect children to the environment, but also supplies them with tools to encourage them to make healthier choices.

Our team of professional artist/educators utilizes mixed media, creative writing, ceramics, singing, drama, collage, dance and painting which they relate to gardening, language arts, botany, and Earth science.

ARTISTS JOB DESCRIPTION

We are looking for three artists who could fill one of the following positions: dance/movement teacher, writer/poet, singer/musician, or a sculptor/still-life teacher. GfH Teaching Artists serve some 6-7 schools in Sedona and the Verde Valley during the school year. Each month they teach for 4.5 hours in each school. This represents three weekly modules of 1.5 hours three days a month. The Teaching Artists teach environmental education using the arts. GfH will train the new Teaching Artists, and they will start in September 2018. This is the perfect job for someone with an art background, who knows about gardening, nutrition, and Earth cycles.

We are looking for part time Teaching Artists with experience who could work on Tuesdays or Thursdays three times per month. Usually these art enrichment classes take place in the afternoon from 1:00 – 2:30.

Teaching Artists earn \$50.00 an hour, for 4.5 classroom hours per school, per month. Prep time and travel time are not compensated. Art supplies are provided.

The requirements are:

1. A Bachelors degree or higher in art, language, humanities;
2. Three years experience working in a camp or elementary school;
3. A willingness to learn, or knowledge about gardening and the environment.

If accepted, an Arizona State fingerprint clearance card will be required to work in the schools. Gardens for Humanity will pay fees for artist to obtain the clearance card.
